




Is the Vent-Os Sinus Dilation procedure right for you?

- (1) After administering local anesthetic, the Vent-OS System is used to access the sinus space
- (2) A small, self-expanding dilator is temporarily placed into the sinus opening
- (3) The device gradually expands by absorbing the moisture from the surrounding mucosa
- (4) The device is removed, thereby restoring drainage and ventilation of the sinus
